



During each legislative session many education-related bills are introduced in the state legislature. Some of the bills receive immediate media focus even though they are unlikely to receive serious consideration or a hearing. MCEA staff monitors legislation in the House and Senate education committees, appropriations and other committees considering legislation that impacts education. Thus far in the 97th Legislative Session, the following education-related bills have warranted monitoring. SENATE BILLS

SB 47 **GSRP Age Eligibility** (Booher, R-Ewart) – A bill to revise the age eligibility (3 years, 9 months) for GSRP due to change in kindergarten age eligibility. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 66 **MMC** (Proos, R-St. Joseph) – A bill to require MDE to provide information about fulfilling MMC requirements through career and technical education programs. *[Passed Senate; On House Floor]*

SB 80 **Expense Reimbursements** (Hansen, R-Hart) – A bill to require LEAs, PSAs, and the EAA to report all employee and board member expense reimbursements online. *[Passed the Senate; In House Education]*

SB 81 **Gifts/Expenses** (Hansen, R-Hart) – A bill to prohibit the use of public funds for purchasing gifts, tickets, alcohol, golf, etc. and requires all expenses to be approved in advance. *[Passed Senate; In House Education]*

SB 83 **Conversion School** (Robertson, R-Grand Blanc) – A bill to outline the process for converting a school on the lowest 5% achieving list to a conversion school. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 89-90 **Sales Tax Exclusion** (Robertson, R-Grand Blanc) – A bill to phase in (10 years) the exclusion of sales tax on the value of trade ins when purchasing a new automobile, boat, or RV. *[PA 160 of 2013; Effective November 6, 2013]*

SB 99 **School Security** (Walker, R-Traverse City) – A bill to allow sinking funds to be used for school security, maintenance and facility improvements. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 100 **Diesel Fuel** (Walker, R-Traverse City) – A bill to allow school districts to enter into financial agreements for purposes of securing diesel fuel pricing. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 112 **Concealed Weapons** (Green, R-Mayville) – A bill to allow a person with a CCW permit to carry weapons at school if authorized by the superintendent or school board. *[In Senate Judiciary]*

SB 120 **Religious Reference** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to prohibit censoring American and Michigan history instruction due to religious references. *[Passed Senate; On House Floor]*

SB 121 **Patriot Week** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to encourage schools to celebrate “Patriot Week”, September 11-17. *[Passed Senate; On House Floor]*

SB 122 **Professional Development** (Hildenbrand, R-Lowell) – A bill to allow 38 hours of professional development for improving student achievement to be counted towards required hours of pupil instruction. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 133 **MMC** (Caswell, R-Hillsdale) – A bill to allow CTE students to substitute science credits for foreign language or art requirements. *[In Senate Education]*

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- SB 135 **Sexual Contact** (Jones, R-Grand Ledge) – A bill to prohibit sexual contact between school employees and students under 21 years of age. *[Passed Senate; On House Floor]*
- SB 182 **School Aid** (Kahn, R-Saginaw Twp) – School Aid act for 2013-14/2014-15. *[Sent to Conference Committee]*
- SB 196 **MDE Appropriations** (Walker, R-Traverse City) – A bill to provide appropriations to the Michigan Department of Education for 2013-14. *[Sent to Conference Committee]*
- SB 232 **ISD Millage** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to permit Wayne RESA to hold an enhancement millage election on any four election dates. *[In Senate Local Government]*
- SB 237-38 **Vaccinations** (Marleau, R-Lake Orion) – A bill to move 6th grade vaccination requirements to 7th grade. *[PA 120/121 of 2013; Effective October 1, 2013]*
- SB 237-39 **Vaccinations** (Marleau, R-Lake Orion) – A bill to move all 6th grade vaccination requirements to 7th grade. *[PA 120/121/122 of 2013; Effective October 1, 2013]*
- SB 244 **ISD** (Robertson, R-Grand Blanc) – A bill to require an ISD financial audit before an ISD superintendent can serve also as a local superintendent. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 267 **Financial Literacy** (Hunter, D-Detroit) – A bill to allow ½ credit financial literacy course to count toward MMC math credit. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 290 **Sinking Fund** (Whitmer, D-East Lansing) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for busses, technology, and security. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 303 **Student Attendance** (Schuitmaker, R-Lawton) – A bill to make public assistance payments contingent upon satisfactory school attendance. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 304 **Attendance Policies** (Schuitmaker, R-Lawton) – A bill to require ISDs and county prosecutors to develop truancy policies. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 305-06 **Driver License** (Schuitmaker, R-Lawton) – A bill to require the Secretary of State to suspend the driver license for 6 months for truant students. *[In Senate Education]*
- SB 371 **Sex Education** (Hopgood, D-Taylor) - A bill to require schools to offer medically accurate, age appropriate sex education classes. *[In Senate Health Policy]*
- SB 374 **Hotline** (Emmons, R-Sheridan) – A bill to create a 24 hour statewide hotline to anonymously report school violence. *[PA 183 of 2013; Effective December 13, 2013]*
- SB 389 **HS Diplomas** (Emmons, R-Sheridan) – A bill to permit LEAs to award high school diplomas to Vietnam veterans. *[PA 55 of 2014; Effective March 25, 2014]*
- SB 395 **Health Benefits** (Caswell, R-Hillsdale) – A bill to adjust caps on premium amounts used in mandatory co-pay calculations. Excludes pay in lieu of health benefits from total benefit calculations. *[In Senate Reforms, Restructuring, and Reinventing]*
- SB 414 **Online Curriculum** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to require school districts to post online curriculum materials on their home page. *[In Senate Education]*

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SB 423 **Assessment** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to encourage schools to teach principles of the Declaration of Independence, and the Michigan and U.S. Constitutions; and to provide assessment questions on the topics. *[Passed the Senate; on House Floor]*

SB 438 **Safety Drills** (Proos, R-St. Joseph) – A bill to assess a 5% School Aid penalty for any school district not conducting required safety drills. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 442-443 **Court Judgments** (Marleau, R-Lake Orion) – A bill to prevent courts from issuing judgments requiring tax levies to pay school debts. *[PA 184 of 2013; Effective December 13, 2013]*

SB 449 **Unpaid Leave** (Ananich, D-Flint) – A bill to require employers to grant unpaid leave for employees to attend their children's school academic activities. *[In Senate Reforms, Restructuring, and Reinventing]*

SB 461 **PSA Boards** (Hopgood, D-Taylor) – A bill to change requirements for PSA board members; limits length of terms, and requires 2 of 7 members be parents of attending students. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 492 **Kindergarten Choice** (Caswell, R-Hillsdale) – A bill to permit kindergarten enrollment under Section 105 or 105c upon written notice. *[Passed Senate; In House Education]*

SB 495-498 **Unfunded Mandates** (Casperson, R-Escanaba) – Bills to allow local units of government to opt out of new requirements for services or activities unless these services or activities are funded; establishes a "local government mandate panel". *[Sent to Senate Local Government and Elections]*

SB 572 **Taser** (Booher, R-Evart) – A bill to permit tasers in gun free school zones. *[On Senate Floor]*

SB 614 **School Bus** (Casperson, R-Escanaba) – A bill to allow commercial motor coaches to serve as school buses. *[In Senate Transportation]*

SB 644 **Strict Discipline Academy** (Hildenbrand, R-Lowell) – A bill to permit the enrollment of pupils in certain facilities operated by a private agency. *[On House Floor]*

SB 681-82 **PSA Lease** (Hopgood, D-Taylor) – A bill to prohibit a PSA from leasing real property from an educational management organization with which the PSA has a school management agreement. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 701 **Civic Heritage** (Colbeck, R-Canton) – A bill to permit the posting of historic writings and documents to encourage a culture of respect for civic heritage. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 716 **Religious Discrimination** (Hansen, R-Hart) – A bill to ensure that schools and universities shall not discriminate against students or their parents/guardians on the basis of their form of worship or religious beliefs. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 745-747 **Concurrent Enrollment** (Booher, R-Evart) – Bills to permit dual enrollment classes to be offered in high schools and taught by qualified high school teachers to enable students to earn college and high school credit. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 775 **School Aid** (Walker, R-Traverse City) – Senate School Aid budget for 2014-15. *[Sent to Conference Committee]*

SB 817 **Professional Evaluation** (Pappageorge, R-Troy) – A bill to change the teacher and administrator evaluation implementation date to the 2015-16 school year. *[PA 257 of 2014; Effective June 28, 2014]*

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SB 902 **School Counselors** (Pappageorge, R-Troy) – A bill to require school counselors in grades 6-12 to complete a 45 hour course in college admission counseling. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 907 **Critical Shortage** (Caswell, R-Hillsdale) – A bill to extend the sunset on the critical shortage list. *[On Senate Floor]*

SB 945 **State Assessments** (Caswell, R-Hillsdale) – A bill to transfer authority and oversight of state assessments from MDE to Treasury. *[On Senate Floor]*

SB 949-957 **Early Warning** (Walker, R-Traverse City) – A series of bills to provide an early warning system for monitoring and regulating school districts in various stages of financial distress. *[In Senate Appropriations]*

SB 1025 **Expulsion** (Hildenbrand, R-Lowell) – A bill to make expulsion mandatory for students threatening to kill a school employee, contractor/vendor, or volunteer. *[In Senate Education]*

SB 1030 **Tax Credit** (Ananich, D-Flint) – A bill to allow a tax credit of up to \$1,000/\$2,000 for parents/guardians for purchasing school supplies. *[In Senate Finance]*

SB 1031 **Sick Leave** (Ananich, D-Flint) – A bill to require employers to provide sick leave. *[In Senate Reforms, Restructuring, Reinventing]*

HB 4001 **FOIA** (Shirkey, R-Clark Lake) – A bill to amend the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) to limit costs that can be charged and outlines penalties for noncompliance. *[Passed House; In Senate Government Operations]*

HB 4043 **Lobbying** (Kelly, R-Midland) – A bill to prohibit the use of school resources for lobbying or other political activities. *[In House Oversight]*

HB 4098 **Concealed Weapons** (MacMaster, R-Kewadin) – A bill to allow a person with CCW permit to carry weapons at school if authorized by the superintendent or school board. *[In House Education]*

HB 4121 **School Property** (Rogers, R-Brighton) – A bill to exempt from taxes any school property sold for five years. *[Passed the House; On Senate Floor]*

HB 4133-34 **Weapons** (Johnson, R-Clare) – A bill to allow retired corrections officers and sheriff deputies with CCW permits to carry concealed weapons on school property. *[Passed the House; On Senate Floor]*

HB 4154 **Letter Grades** (Yonker, R-Caledonia) – A bill to require the superintendent of public instruction to implement letter grades to each school building. *[On House Floor]*

HB 4175 **Teaching Certificate** (Somerville, R-New Boston) – A bill to eliminate certification or course work beyond the provisional certificate to teach in Michigan. *[In House Education]*

HB 4188 **Flu Vaccinations** (Kelly, R-Saginaw Twp.) – A bill to prohibit schools from requiring flu vaccinations for students to attend school. *[In House Education]*

HB 4190 **MPSERS** (Farrington, R-Utica) – A bill to calculate the MPSERS unfunded liability based on current operating expenses (COE). *[In House Financial Liability Reform]*

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- HB 4201 **PERA** (Kelly, R-Saginaw Twp.) – A bill to amend PERA to prohibit employees or unions from using public facilities for political activities, union organizing, and membership solicitation. *[In House Oversight]*
- HB 4202 **Internet** (Kowall, R-White Lake) – A bill to require the collection of sales tax on internet sales. *[On House Floor]*
- HB 4227 **School Aid** (Rogers, R-Brighton) – K-12 School Aid Appropriations for 2013-14 and 2014-15. *[Sent to Conference Committee]*
- HB 4228 **Education Budget** (Rogers, R-Brighton) – Education omnibus bill for 2013-14 for K-12, community college and higher education. *[PA 60 of 2013; Signed June 13, 2013]*
- HB 4269 **School Safety Commission** (Nathan, D-Detroit) – A bill to create a statewide school safety commission to recommend policies and procedures to prevent school violence. *[In House Education]*
- HB 4272 **Cardiac Emergency** (Haines, R-Waterford) – A bill to allow schools to substitute a cardiac emergency drill for a required fire drill; requires schools to adopt a cardiac emergency plan. *[Passed House; On Senate Floor]*
- HB 4273 **Cardiac Emergency** (Haines, R-Waterford) – A bill to require MDE to develop materials and training related to sudden cardiac arrest for all coaches and athletes. *[In House Education]*
- HB 4276 **Common Core** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to prohibit the State Board of Education from participating in the Common Core Standards initiative. *[In House Education]*
- HB 4281 **Sinking Funds** (McCready, R-Bloomfield Hills) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for school security and technology. *[In House Education]*
- HB 4314 **FOIA Commission** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to create a commission to hear Freedom of Information Act complaints. *[In House Oversight]*
- HB 4352-53 **Epi Pen** (Lyons, R-Alto) – A bill to allow schools to have epinephrine pens; requires schools to train staff in their use. *[PA 186/187 of 2013; Effective March 14, 2014]*
- HB 4365 **English/Grammar** (Genetski, R-Saugatuck) – A bill to require successful completion of an English language, grammar, and usage course before teacher certification. *[In House Education]*
- HB 4368 **Sinking Fund** (Schor, D-Lansing) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for school security. *[In House Tax Policy]*
- HB 4369 **EAA** (Lyons, R-Alto) – A bill to codify the Education Achievement Authority and expand it statewide. *[Passed House; On Senate Floor]*
- HB 4387 **Sinking Funds** (Crawford, R-Novu) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for busses, computers, and software. *[In House Tax Policy]*
- HB 4388 **Attendance** (Pscholka, R-Stevensville) – A bill to make welfare benefits contingent upon satisfactory attendance of school-aged children. *[Passed House; In Senate Families, Seniors, Human Services]*
- HB 4447 **Alternative Ed** (Genetski, R-Saugatuck) – A bill to allow the State Superintendent to grant an alternative teaching certificate to teach math or science in grades 6-12 under certain conditions. *[In House Education]*

HB 4454 **Attendance** (Segal, D-Battle Creek) – A bill to prohibit religious holiday absences from counting against a student's attendance record. *[On House Floor]*

HB 4465-66 **MMC** (McBroom, R-Vulcan) – Bills to revise the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements in math and foreign language; clarifies personal curriculum. *[PA 208 of 2014; Effective Sine Die]*

HB 4471 **Inclement Weather** (Potvin, R-Cadillac) – A bill to exempt school districts from sanctions when inclement weather prohibited a school district from meeting minimum required days, but met 1098 required instructional hours. *[PA 29 of 2013; Signed May 16, 2013]*

HB 4483 **Sinking Fund** (Knezek, D-Dearborn Heights) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for technology. *[In House Education]*

HB 4490 **Expulsion** (Stallworth, D-Detroit) – A bill to change "shall" to "may" expel for physical assaults; requires behavior risk assessment and plan for reinstatement. *[In House Education]*

HB 4504 **Mental Health** (Lyons, R-Alto) – A bill to require LEA's to pay a prorated share of foundation for any student placed in a mental health facility. *[In House Appropriations]*

HB 4515 **Sinking Funds** (Zemke, Ann Arbor) – A bill to expand the use of sinking funds for busses. *[In House Education]*

HB 4606-07 **Truancy** (Haines, R-Waterford) – A bill to require the Secretary of State to suspend the driver license of truant students for 6 months. *[In House Education]*

HB 4625 **Merit Pay** (Lund, R-Shelby Twp) – A bill to require teacher compensation based on student achievement; limits compensation for advanced degrees. *[On House Floor]*

HB 4652-53 **Health/PE** (Tlaib, D-Detroit) – A bill to require health education and physical education to be eligible for full foundation allowance. *[In House Education]*

HB 4713 **Emergency Drills** (Graves, R-Argentine Twp.) – A bill to require schools to post emergency drill information on their websites. *[PA 12 of 2014; Effective July 1, 2014]*

HB 4725 **Residential Boarding** (Olumba, I-Highland Park) – A bill to allow PSA's to operate residential boarding schools for at-risk students. *[On House Floor]*

HB 4727 **Cyber Bullying** (Abed, D-Grand Ledge) – A bill to require cyber bullying to be included in school district bullying policy. *[In House Education]*

HB 4734-35 **School Mascot** (Genetski, R-Saugatuck) – A bill to establish a reimbursement fund to be used by qualifying school districts when changing mascots. *[In House Appropriations]*

HB 4813/4815 **Dissolution** (Rogers, R-Brighton) – Bills to establish criteria and procedures to dissolve certain financially nonviable school districts. *[PA 96/97 of 2013; Effective October 1, 2013]*

HB 4836 **Transferring Students** (Lipton, D-Huntington Woods) – A bill to require parent consent prior to sending student information to out of state organizations. *[In House Education]*

HB 4837 **State Assessments** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to permit access to state mandated tests for public inspection by parents/guardians. *[In House Education]*

HB 4838 **Brand Names** (Hooker, R-Byron) – A bill to prevent commercial product brand names from appearing on required pupil assessment documents. *[In House Education]*

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HB 4844 **Start Date** (Schor, D-Lansing) – A bill to allow school start dates prior to Labor Day. *[In House Tourism]*

HB 4845-46 **Early Graduation** (Foster, R-Pellston) – Bills to reduce state aid to school districts for students who graduate early, and to provide a \$2500 college scholarship to those early graduates. *[In House Education]*

HB 4847 **Incarcerated Students** (Genetski, R-Saugatuck) – A bill to permit the exclusion of incarcerated student information from MDE accreditation and required annual reports. *[In House Education]*

HB 4849 **Achievement Gap** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to prevent MDE from utilizing achievement gap data in schools as a means of determining sanctions or student achievement labels. *[In House Education]*

HB 4870-71 **Fiscal Insolvency** (Oakes, D-Saginaw) – A bill to assign the governance of fiscally insolvent school districts to the ISD for up to 8 years, and to permit the use of the insolvent school district's 18 mil levy to pay down the financial deficit. *[In House Education]*

HB 4879 **MEAP/MMC Tests** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to require all public officials, including legislators, to take all statewide achievement tests given to students, and to publish the results. *[In House Government Operations]*

HB 4894 **Health Ed** (Stallworth, D-Detroit) – A bill to require the teaching of health education in all public schools. *[In House Education]*

HB 4955 **Dual Enrollment** (Foster, R-Pellston) – A bill to prohibit any public or private school from denying an eligible student's request for dual enrollment. *[In House Education]*

HB 4956 **Building Lease** (Foster, R-Pellston) – A bill to require the sale or lease of an unused state facility for a lawful instructional purpose. The lease shall be for \$1.00. *[In House Education]*

HB 4972 **Common Core** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to prohibit the State Board of Education from adopting or implementing the Common Core State Standards. *[In House Education]*

HB 4982 **Year Round School** (Schor, D-Lansing) – A bill to establish a \$10 million fund to pilot year round schools in selected at-risk school districts. *[In House Appropriations]*

HB 4992 **Demographic Data** (Schor, D-Lansing) – A bill to permit schools from reporting demographic data on any state assessments. *[In House Education]*

HB 5044 **Student Information** (Kelly, R-Saginaw) – A bill to prohibit disclosure of any personal student information on any tests or online coursework. *[In House Education]*

HB 5111 **3rd Grade Reading** (Price, R-Holland) – A bill to require all 3rd grade students to be proficient in reading before promotion to fourth grade. *[On House Floor]*

HB 5115-16 **Sinking Funds** (Lyons, R-Alto) – A bill to restrict all school millage and sinking fund elections to August or November. *[In House Elections and Ethics]*

HB 5127 **Safe Schools Fund** (Geiss, D-Taylor) – A bill to create a safe and secure schools fund from fees or fines collected from individuals convicted of a misdemeanor or felony. *[In House Appropriations]*

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HB 5128 **Teacher Turnover** (Yonker, R-Caledonia) – A bill to require school districts to post on their websites data regarding teacher turnover. *[In House Education]*

HB 5129 **Staffing Ratios** (Townsend, D-Royal Oak) – A bill to require schools to report teacher/student, nurse/student, counselor/student, psychologist/student, and social worker/student ratios to CEPI. *[In House Education]*

HB 5144 **Reading Intervention** (Stallworth, D-Detroit) – A bill to require MDE to adopt policies and programs that ensure children attain reading proficiency by the end of 3rd grade. *[On House Floor]*

HB 5181 **Critical Shortage** (Somerville, R-New Boston) – A bill to extend the expiration of the critical shortage list to June 30, 2016. *[In House Education]*

HB 5196 **Physical Education** (Lori, R-Constantine) – A bill to require 30 minutes of P.E. weekly for grades K-5 and 45 minutes of P.E. weekly for grades 6-8. *[In House Education]*

HB 5203 **Teacher Evaluation** (Howrylak, R-Troy) – A bill to move teacher and administrator evaluation requirements to 2015-16. *[In House Education]*

HB 5208-09 **Driver License** (Schor, D-Lansing) – Bills to prohibit the issuance of a driver license to truant students. *[In House Transportation and Infrastructure]*

HB 5221 **Student Mistreatment** (Heise, R-Plymouth) – A bill to require the timely notification of alleged maltreatment of a student to parents and guardians. *[In House Education]*

HB 5223-24 **Teacher/Administrator Evaluation** (O'Brien, R-Portage) – Bills to outline teacher and administrator performance evaluation requirements. *[Passed House; In Senate Education]*

HB 5268 **School Audits** (Lipton, D-Huntington Woods) – A bill to require comprehensive school audits, monitoring, and implementation of transformation reform plans for low performing schools. *[In House Education]*

HB 5544 **Holocaust** (Lipton, D-Huntington Woods) – A bill to require teaching about the Holocaust. *[In House Education]*

HB 5550 **Classroom Assignments** (Townsend, D-Royal Oak) – A bill to require schools to comply with parent requests for classroom assignments of multiple birth siblings. *[In House Education]*

HB 5581 **State Assessments** (Genetski, R-Saugatuck) – A bill to transfer authority and oversight of state assessments from MDE to Treasury. *[On House Floor]*

HB 5596 **Expulsion** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to require school districts to provide discretion for suspension or expulsion, unless expulsion is required by state or federal law. *[In House Education]*

HB 5607 **Attendance** (Santana, D-Detroit) – A bill to require districts to allow students to remain in the district when the student becomes a non-resident after the Fall membership count date. *[In House Education]*

HB 5611 **Human Trafficking** (Shirkey, R-Clarklake) – A bill to require MDE to develop a model curriculum in human trafficking. *[In House Education]*

HB 5613 **Extracurricular** (McMillan, R-Rochester Hills) – A bill to allow home schooled students to participate in school districts' extracurricular activities. *[In House Education]*

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HB 5618 **Diplomas** (Oakes, D-Saginaw) – A bill to allow Vietnam veterans to receive a high school diploma. *[In House Military Affairs]*

HB 5619 **ISD Monitoring** (Oakes, D-Saginaw) – A bill to require school districts to allow ISD access to financial information; permit ISD to monitor local constituent school district budgets and finances. *[In House Education]*

HB 5621 **Fire Fighting** (Oakes, D-Saginaw) – A bill to allow girl scout organizations to participate in firefighter training programs. *[In House Local Government]*

HB 5622 **K-3 Class Size** (Oakes, D-Saginaw) – A bill to require schools who have been on Priority Schools List for four (4) years to maintain a K-3 class size no greater than 17 students. *[In House Education]*

HB 5628 **Dissolved District Buildings** (Geiss, D-Taylor) – A bill to permit receiving district of dissolve district buildings to decline ownership of those buildings. *[In House Education]*

HB 5629 **At-Risk** (Olumba, I-Highland Park) – A bill to provide funding for a boarding school pilot program for at-risk students. *[In House Appropriations]*
