

Michigan Public Acts
2009-10

The following are education related public acts enacted by the Michigan Legislature during the 2009-10 school year.

2009

PA 22 (HB4397) – Allows the Treasurer of a school district or intermediate school district to invest funds in certificates of deposit in one or more insured credit unions. [Effective May 5, 2009]

PA 121 (HB4447) – 2009-10 State School Aid Act. [Effective October 19, 2009]

PA 186 (HB5298) – Modifies school residency status for foster care student to enroll in and attend a school in which he/she is placed by the Department of Human Services whether or not the student resides in the school district. [Effective December 17, 2009]

PA 187 (HB5299) – Allows a foster care student to be counted for pupil membership purposes while enrolled in a school in which he/she is placed by the Department of Human Services whether or not the student resides in the school district. [Effective December 17, 2009]

PA 201 (HB4788) – Revises the Public Employment Relations Act to include the State School Reform/Redesign Officer or the Chief Educational Officer of a public school(s) as the public school employer for purposes of collective bargaining. [Effective January 4, 2010]

PA 202 (HB5596) – Establishes an alternative program for a person to earn an interim teaching certificate leading to a Michigan Provisional Teaching Certificate after three years of satisfactory performance. [Effective January 4, 2010]

PA 203 (SB926) – Requires the Center for Educational Performance and Information and the Michigan Department of Education to design and implement a system to enable to link individual teachers to individual student academic performance; requires Boards of Education of school districts and intermediate school districts to ensure adequate teaching supplies are provided; establishes a minimum number of instructional days in a school year; establishes cyber schools and cyber school attendance for membership purposes. [Effective January 4, 2010]

PA 204 (HB4787) – Establishes criteria and a process to identify persistently failing schools; creates a State School Reform/ Redesign Statewide School district; raises the compulsory attendance age to 18. [Effective January 4, 2010]

PA 205 (SB981) – Authorizes and defines “schools of excellence” and “cyber schools”. [Effective January 4, 2010]

PA 52 (SB129) – Amends the canvassing of school district elections when a school district lies in more than one county. [Effective April 22, 2010]

PA 52 (SB455) – Revises the provisions for conducting a vote recount to make the filing requirements consistent with the provisions for canvassing school district elections. [Effective April 22, 2010]

PA 75 (SB1227) – Implements changes to the Michigan Public School Employee Retirement System. [Effective May 19, 2010]

PA 77 (HB 4073) – Establishes the Michigan Public Employee Retirement Health Care Trust. [Effective May 19, 2010]

PA 80 (SB757) – Revises Michigan mathematic graduation requirements to enable fulfillment of the Algebra II requirement through certain criteria met as a part of a personal curriculum plan; revises educational development plan process and timelines. [Effective July 1, 2011]

PA 91 (SB1097) – Permits the use of gaming compact funds to establish college scholarships for students or graduates. [Effective June 10, 2010]

PA 93 (HB5363) – Modifies provisions regarding waivers for school bus driver safety education certification. [Effective June 22, 2010]
